

Enrichment Programmes

In addition to the core curriculum, St Heliers School provides a wide range of experiences and resources to foster student learning.

St Heliers School features an aquatics programme that prepares students for safe use of the local environment and develops basic swimming competencies. The programmes are: **Tutored Swim Programme** for Years 3 to 6. **Aquapass** for Year 7 and 8 students. **Waterwise** – sailing and kayaking for Year 8 students.

Education Outside of the Classroom: Opportunities are provided for students to make use of resources within our region. These experiences are an important part of enriching learning.

Performing Arts: Each year many opportunities are available for students to take part in performing arts groups, including the school choir, boys' choir, cheer squad, hip hop and jump jam - students leading other students in aerobic exercise.

School Camp is offered to Year 8 students each year, which is part of 'Education Outside of the Classroom' programmes to develop communication, problem solving, self-management, social co-operation and physical skills.

A Second Language Programme (Mandarin) is taught to all Year 5 to 8 students. A qualified Mandarin Learning Assistant is employed to assist teachers in the delivery of the programme.

Classroom Sports Programmes provide opportunities for healthy competition.

Pastoral Care for International Students

St Heliers School accepts a limited number of international students each year. Our international students have regular pastoral care sessions with the International Student Manager who support the students while they are studying at our school.

The social and academic progress of each international student is monitored carefully to ensure that students are working to their potential and are happy at school and at home.

Accommodation: Students in Years 1 to 6 must live with a parent while studying in New Zealand. Students in Years 7 and 8 may live with a parent or in a Kiwi homestay.

ESOL – (English for Speakers of Other Languages)

International students are placed in mainstream classes at their appropriate year level and long term international students receive ESOL support from qualified, specialist ESOL teachers.



The New Zealand Core Curriculum — Educating for Excellence

The New Zealand curriculum standards are highly regarded internationally.

The school curriculum is made up of **eight** essential learning areas that are prescribed by the Ministry of Education: English, Mathematics & Statistics, Science, Technology, Social Science, Health and Physical Education, The Arts, and Learning Languages.

Underpinning the curriculum areas are five key competencies: Thinking; Using Language, Symbols and Texts; Relating to Others; Managing Self; Participating and Contributing.

Inquiry learning is a school-wide approach where many of the essential learning areas are taught through an Inquiry model. St Heliers School Inquiry Learning enables students to become responsible, self-directed, and life-long learners, who are critical thinkers and effective problem solvers with the ability to ask and act upon higher order questions.
