


It is nice to have more students are now back at school and attendance is beginning to rise again. As of yesterday we had 85.8% attendance. It has been fantastic to see more parents at special events such as Merit Assemblies and school trips and we are hoping that very soon we will open up our school to parents more as the number of positive cases in the school decreases. HOW OUR SCHOOL IS TRACKING WITH COVID

Last night at the board meeting I presented these graphs to the members. You can continue to track new daily cases in the newsletter section of the school website. Some interesting points to note:

- The number of household contacts have been decreasing over the last week and some class sizes are returning to normal
- The number of our children testing positive has been decreasing with only one student on some days
- We are yet to reach a day with 0 new cases
- There have been very few staff who have tested positive
- The number of staff isolating at any one time has been low
- The reduction in the numbers of days one is required to isolate is increasing the speed with which children can return to school
- The symptoms of those testing positive to COVID-19 in general has been worse for adults than it has been for children

We would be grateful if you could return any found books either to the school office or your child can return them to the library during their class library time.


Your help is greatly appreciated in maintaining the wonderful resource our school library provides for everyone to enjoy.

STEPPING OUT WITH CONSTABLE GORDAN



Stepping Out has been developed by the NZ Police because they are concerned about the safety of young children on our roads. The sad fact is that children aged 5-9 years are our highest casualty group. For this reason, and because the road safety skills of these children are undeveloped, the NZ Police recommend that children aged five or six do not cross the road on their own and where possible walk to school with someone older.

Stepping Out is taught by Year 1 teachers with the support of our Police Education officer Constable Gordan.



Throughout the week, Constable Gordan assisted teachers with the practical component of the programme where the children were learning to use the crossing safely. Year 1 teachers would like to thank Constable Gordan for his support.



Research shows that children learn best about road safety when they are taken out for practical activities with a responsible adult. We encourage parents to take every opportunity they can to take their child out and ask them about safe road practices. Parents should also be aware of the importance of modelling safe road safety practices.

TWO IMPORTANT NOTICES

Accord Teacher Only Day

We would like to give you advanced notice of a Teacher Only Day on **Tuesday 7 June**. This is the day after Queen's Birthday. The school will be closed to all students on that day.

The teachers collective agreement allowed 8 Teacher Only days to be held from mid 2019 to 2022. We have two days left, the 7th of June is the first of these two days.

These days are to provide teachers and principals additional time to:

- Deepen their knowledge and practice around the local curriculum (within the context of the removal of national standards)
- Strengthen their understanding of the use of assessment tools for learning and teaching
- Respond to the recommendations of the education work programme in the Curriculum, Progress and Achievement (CPA) Report
- Familiarise themselves with curriculum work changes that will become available over the term of the collective agreements.

Out-of-Zone Places

There will be 5 places for students who live outside the school enrolment zone who turn 5 after 1 May 2022 and before 8 June 2022.

There will be 10 places for students who live outside the school enrolment zone who turn 5 after June 7 2022 and before 18 October 2022.

Applications open on Wednesday 23 March, when the ad appears in The East and Bays Courier, and close at 3pm, Thursday 5 May 2022. If a ballot is required this will be held on Friday 6 May 2022.

We will also send the ad out to you via eTAP next Wednesday.

Out-of-Zone Applications for 2023 will be advertised to the community in August this year.
