Dear Parents and Caregivers

Tēnā koutou katoa

We have had a busy two weeks since the last newsletter with many events and activities. As you will see we have 3 pages of sports news in this newsletter. Thank you to our wonderful teachers who go above and beyond to provide meaningful and uplifting learning experiences for our children and the parents who support this.

The Year 7&8 children had a wonderful experience at Camp Adair last week. There were 160 students at camp plus parents and teachers. I was lucky enough to go out on Friday and was so pleased to see how well everything was going. The children were happy and fully involved in the activities. They challenged themselves, and the teachers and parents were fantastic. Many thanks to all those parents who gave their time to either help transport or supervise at camp, we can't do it without your help. While many primary schools no longer have camps due to health and safety regulations, cost, busy parents, and time commitment required of teachers, at St Heliers School we are lucky we have dedicated teachers willing to organise and give up their family time to take your children to camp, and wonderful parents who offer to support the teachers.

Next Friday we will be having Harmony Day, a day when all the students in the school take part in a range of cultural activities. I would like to encourage all the children to come dressed in national costume. This year the teachers will be running the majority of the activities as we have only had a few parents come forward to share something from their culture. If there are any more parents who would like to help a teacher with an activity for the day then please contact the office. Unfortunately, we cannot have spectators as it will be a busy, bustling day and we would like the older children to show leadership, and care for the younger children in their group.

Tomorrow we have our Citizenship Assembly. As well as recognising those children who consistently uphold our school values and display citizenship qualities, we will also be announcing the Student Leaders for 2023 and presenting them with their badges. There is a comprehensive process to become a Student Leader. They are required to complete a written application, followed by a stand up pitch to the Senior Leadership Team, Y7&8 teachers, and all the Year 7&8 students, who then have the opportunity to vote for 2 candidates. A tally of the student votes go to the Y7&8 teachers who then observe the children at camp, before meeting with the SLT to deliberate and make the final selection. This year we had 55 students apply and 13 were accepted. Fortunately, we have many other opportunities in the school to demonstrate leadership and Student Leaders who are House Captains relinquish this position to someone else.



YEAR 5 AND 6 TIRITIRI MATANGI TRIP

Year 5 and 6 students are currently learning about biodiversity as their Inquiry topic focus. Despite initial cancellations and disruptions, all six classes have managed to experience day trips by ferry out to Tiritiri Matangi which is a bird sanctuary in the Hauraki Gulf about an hour and 20 minutes away from downtown Auckland.

On arrival everyone was welcomed by a Department of Conservation worker as well as volunteer guides who speak proudly and knowledgeably about Tiritiri Matangi. Grouped with an allocated guide, the children were given a first hand experience around the island. A wealth of information was shared from the volunteer guides, where they helped students identify native birds in their natural habitat and discussed trees and other plant life. The children were also able to utilise this time to ask relevant questions to enhance their knowledge and understanding around biodiversity.

Students enjoyed the learning experience and had an excellent time furthering their knowledge and understanding of native bird life in Aotearoa.

LINEWIZE

We are very excited to announce that we are partnering with Linewize to further increase online safety at St Heliers School. Linewize is a school manager network and safety monitoring system for each of our Year 5-8 children whilst using their @shs.school.nz account.

The Online Safety Hub is now live and includes access to the Qustodio Parent app. We invite you to join us in further building healthy digital habits and a safe online environment for your child by creating your own Qustodio account to use at home across two devices free of charge.

Key features include:

- Filter and block apps and content that you don't want your child to see
- Customise what your child can access during homework hours
- Balance screen time by setting time limits on devices as well as for specific apps
- Protect screen-free moments such as mealtimes and bedtimes
- As an extra safety measure, we have disabled all of our student accounts between 9 pm and 7.30am each night

One parent/guardian needs to create the account in the first instance, and then additional parents/guardians can be invited and given access to the same features once the account has been created.
