They have been learning how to write their hypothesis, method and results and all showed a strong understanding of a 'fair test'. Miss Gormley, our Science teacher, will be very impressed when these children become Year 7 students. Kākahi shared their pod casts and research around their inquiry topic - Conflict. There was an interesting array of questions and topics. The standard across the Year 7&8 team is impressive.

This week is Support Staff Week and yesterday we celebrated the amazing work all our support staff do by holding a lovely morning tea, especially for them. They do amazing work which supports the learning of our students, allowing our school to function smoothly and efficiently.

We say farewell to Miss Melanie Momsen who has been the classroom teacher in Room 21. She will be taking a teaching roll in Christchurch where she is relocating to. We thank her for all her commitment and care to the children. We welcome Miss Anita Minnaar to St Heliers School and Room 21. She brings a wealth of experience to this roll. She will introduce herself to you all in the first newsletter next term.

#### TEREHU (YEAR 0-2) DINGLE DELL WALK—TUESDAY 13 JUNE

On Tuesday in Week 8, the Terehu, Year 0-2 Team went on a hike to Dingle Dell to observe what kind of insect life we could find in our local park environment. Following our study of minibeasts this term, the children were excited to see for themselves what and how many they could find in our own neighbourhood.

We were so lucky to have an expert parent, Claudio Cubillos-Ruiz, our resident entomologist to lead us and give us some pointers on how to find the insects, how to observe them and how to put them safely back into their habitat. The children all had a fabulous walk and were heard to say "This is the best trip ever!"

When we returned from our walk, Dr Cubillos-Ruiz gave us a presentation on his study of stick insects in South America and Canada and the children were treated to an interactive experience of how to pin and observe insects as well as several slides to view through a microscope.

Our resulting written work showed lots of new learning and a deeper understanding of the insect ecosystem.


The two teams that got selected to go through to the inter school competition were 'The Missing Screwdrivers' and 'Builder Beavers'.

#### SCHOOL UNIFORM

We are very proud of our school uniform which our Board has the responsibility of setting the code for. We believe that wearing a school uniform helps promote school pride and unity, and provides an increased school identity within and beyond the community.

Last week at our morning assemblies we talked to all the children about our school uniform as there have been a few children wearing items that do not meet our uniform policy. Please can you support us by ensuring that by the start of Term 3 your child wears our school uniform correctly and adheres to the following;

- footwear which are black shoes or sandals that are totally black without any white showing. No boots are allowed.
- socks that follow the policy which is on our school website, found at 'Our School, School Policies, Uniform Policy'
- all hair accessories must be the school colours
- long sleeved school shirt to cover a long sleeved undergarment

All children must wear their school uniform to and from school and footwear must be on. The exception is our sports uniform may be worn by senior children who have an early morning sports practice or are attending Bay Suburbs or Eastern Zone sports tournaments. School uniforms including school shoes must be in school bags if arriving in sports uniforms for early morning sport practices.

If there is a medical reason as to why your child will be wearing something that does not conform to our uniform policy, please ensure both the classroom teacher and the school office have this in writing.

We will be checking uniforms on a regular basis from the start of Term 3.

# PAIKEA Year 3&4 Jumping June Skip Off Wednesday June 13th 2023 BLOCK 2

St Heliers School Paikea Team held its very first Year 3&4 **HEART FOUNDATION JUMPING JUNE SKIP OFF** during Week 8. All the Year 3&4 students present on the day were able to take part in New Zealand's LARGEST Annual Nationwide Skip-A-Thon to raise money for the Heart Foundation - the only organisation that is dedicated to supporting all the children born every single week with heart defects in New Zealand.

Team Paikea teachers assisted their students to get prepped and ready for the Jumping June Skip Off by including skipping skills before school activities, fitness and PE sessions beginning sometime in Week 5. Each student received their very own personalised skipping rope (theirs to keep) to use at those times.

On the Jumping June Skip Off Day, the Paikea, Year 3&4, students jumped rope, hula hooped and jogged for one hour (in total - some breaks are included in between) travelling in differentiated Paikea skipping groups, moving from activity to activity every 4-5 minutes. There was music, water breaks, pavement chalk drawings and lemonade ice blocks for all at the completion of the event. Parents were encouraged to attend the event and were a valuable asset on the day.

All funds raised through St Heliers School Paikea Jumping June go directly to Heart Children (New Zealand's Child and Youth programme and services.) Through their participation in the Jumping June Skip-Off, Paikea students are helping other children living with a heart condition. It has been a great way for our children to learn the importance of supporting others in the community. To date our Paikea Jumping June Skip Off sponsorship donations have raised over \$15,000. The Dragon Boat Festival, also known as Duanwu Festival, is an annual event celebrated on the 5th day of the 5th month of the Chinese lunar calendar. With a history spanning over 2,000 years, this festival holds great cultural and historical significance in China and among Chinese communities worldwide.

The festival is observed by racing dragon boats, eating zongzi (sticky rice dumplings), and hanging up colorful silk threads, all of which pay homage to Qu Yuan and his legacy.

In 2023, the dragon boat festival falls on 22 June. All classes at school, learnt about the festival by making a paper dragon boat, in Year 1&2 a paper dragon, in Year 3&4 a dragon boat, in Year 5&6, and in Year 7&8 a paper plate dragon. The children all really enjoyed making these artworks.
